Executive Director Report

Esports Program Development

Thanks to continued support by the Student Government Association (SGA), the K-State Esports Arena continues to see enhancements. Additional stations provide locations for use of console play and multiple screens allow for better game play. With these additions, plus the increased membership of students with the Esports Club, additional tournament participation both within the Union as well as other regional and national tournaments was achieved.

Association Conference Host

The K-State Student Union was privileged to host the Association of College Unions International (ACUI) Region II Conference in November. Hosting the conference allowed the Union and the university to showcase wonderful facilities and abilities to college unions from more than six states. In addition, many Union staff members were able to participate in staff development programs the conference provided.

Commerce Bank Renovation

Commerce Bank was awarded the contract for banking services for the university in 2023. As part of the new agreement, Commerce began planning for a major modification of the Union branch location. The planning process was ongoing during the 2023-24 academic year with construction slated to being in September 2024. The modifications will change the way services are provided and provide greater use of advanced banking technology.

Infrastructure Replacements

The Union made great strides in the continued replacement of several heating and air conditioning units, all more than 50 years of age. With the additional support from SGA, three older units were replaced with new, more efficient units that service large areas of the Union. The effectiveness of the units will provide more comfort and savings on energy consumption.

Bowling Center Improvements

After much research and consideration, the Union embarked on a large investment to upgrade the Union Bowling Center. The 40-year-old mechanical bowling equipment was removed and replaced with cutting-edge QubicaAMF EDGE string pinsetters, the latest innovation in the industry. The extensive project not only replaced the aging pinsetter machines but also included the installation of new gutters and capping, a state-of-the-art scoring system and bowling ball returns. String pinsetters were approved for use in centers by the United States Bowling Congress, the national governing body for the sport of bowling, in April 2023. The investment is anticipated to enhance the experience of bowling customers and allow the Union to save on energy expenses. The center will reopen to campus and the public in August 2024.







Business Services

Food Service

Union food service operations experienced a continued rebound towards pre-pandemic performances for 2023-24. Revenue for the fiscal year cleared \$353,000 yet remained about 17% below anticipated budgets. The Union and partners actively adapted to challenging circumstances to provide necessary products and services to support the needs of the student body and campus as a whole.

- Gross sales at \$2.75 million
- Dining Dollars program: 9,940 completed transactions; \$235,000 revenue generated
- Cat Cash: 30,101 transactions; \$187,000 revenue generated
- Chick-fil-A facility enhancement project
- Established campus-wide food truck process








Operations


Accomplishments:

- Technology upgrades in the Big 12 Room
- Technology improvements to the Bluemont Room audio system
- HVAC replacement of two units in the Bowling Center
- Forum Hall HVAC unit replacement
- Renovation of Union 206 wallcovering and carpeting
- Setup 16 computers for old equipment upgrades and new installations mostly in the ID Center, business office and conference rooms.
- Migrated the campus declining balance and meal plan system from Cbord to Atrium.
- Switched the esports area to pods of five to accommodate tournaments with teams of that size. Installed another set of gaming computers for a total of 36 computers, additional laptops and furniture.

Bowling Center

Wabash Cannon Bowl in the Union Bowling Center began renovation in June 2024 to implement cutting-edge QubicaAMF EDGE string pinsetters, the latest innovation in the industry. The extensive project will replace the aging pinsetter machines and includes the installation of new gutters and capping, a state-of-the-art scoring system and bowling ball returns. String pinsetters were approved for use in centers by the United States Bowling Congress, the national governing body for the sport of bowling, in April 2023. The improvements will provide an excellent patron experience and provide more than 150 different bowling games from which customers can choose. The center plans to reopen in early Aug. 2024.
